ISTG Internship Position – 2012/2013

Description

The Innovative Science and Technology Group (ISTG) currently has open internship positions. Although these are non-paid positions, interested candidates will be given recommendation letters for excellent work. In addition, interns will be given the chance to participate in the development of international projects, including serving as potential liaisons to ISTG international partners, and taking part in grant writing and other funding opportunities. Below are descriptions of two current positions.

Position 1

Intern sought to work on the development of a joint US-Africa high school program aimed at fostering science and technology development between US and African students. The intern will be expected to assist ISTG directors with program development, correspond with participating partners, perform extensive research (using the internet and library sources) on specific topics, and write reports. The program is expected to launch in the Spring of 2013.

Position 2

Intern sought to develop and maintain a social media presence for ISTG, as well as managing ISTG's newsletter. Responsibilities include developing and managing ISTG's social media presence, updating newsletter information on the ISTG website, and mailing out the newsletters to ISTG members.

Requirements

The positions require an average of 10 hrs per week of work. However, hours are flexible, and the prospective intern could work from home.

Eligibility

Interested candidates are expected to satisfy the following eligibility requirements:

- Good interpersonal skills
- Excellent writer (at least college-level)
- Highly motivated and self-sufficient
- Dependable
- Ability to use good judgment
- Resourceful
